Since its inception at the 2005 COP in Montreal, this event has successfully brought together hundreds of jurists, legal researchers, IGO officers, parliamentarians, national delegates, legal professionals, students and professors working on legal issues surrounding climate change. The last Climate Law and Governance Day 2019 in Madrid, Spain during UNFCCC COP25 welcomed over 900 registrants, many of whom were accredited COP delegates and observers from national delegations, intergovernmental organisations, law and governance practitioners and civil society, as well as judges, professors and students.
